STATE WATER RESOURCES CONTROL BOARD RESOLUTION NO. 76-36

AUTHORIZING EXECUTION OF AN AGREEMENT WITH THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH AND THE DEPARTMENT OF WATER RESOURCES TO SPONSOR JOINTLY PORTIONS OF THE STUDY "GROUNDWATER INJECTION OF RECLAIMED WATER IN PALO ALTO" PROPOSED BY STANFORD UNIVERSITY

WHEREAS:

- 1. Division 7, Chapter 7, Article 2 of the State Water Code directs the State to "...undertake all possible steps to encourage development of water reclamation facilities so that reclaimed water may be made available to help meet the growing requirements of the State".
- 2. The Consulting Panel on Health Aspects of Wastewater Reclamation for Groundwater Recharge, which the State Board sponsored jointly with the Departments of Health and Water Resources, identified research needed before further decisions can be made about conditions under which reclaimed water can be used for groundwater recharge to augment domestic water supplies.
- 3. Stanford University proposes a study of "Groundwater Injection of Reclaimed Water in Palo Alto" which will address several of the research areas recommended by the Consulting Panel.
- 4. Stanford University submitted a proposal for this study to the Environmental Protection Agency and the State Board and requested their participation in funding of this study.

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED:

That the Executive Officer be authorized to negotiate and execute an interagency agreement with the Department of Health and the Department of Water Resources to sponsor jointly the study of "Groundwater Injection of Reclaimed Water in Palo Alto" proposed by Stanford University and a contract with Stanford University for a period of three years and for an amount not to exceed \$45,000 of Clean Water Bond funds plus any funds provided to the State Board by the Department of Water Resources for support of the study contingent upon the award of an Environmental Protection Agency grant for this study.
