RESOLUTION NO. 77-39

APPROVAL OF (1) AN AMENDMENT TO THE WATER QUALITY CONTROL PLAN, TULARE LAKE BASIN (5D), AND (2) AN AMENDMENT TO THE CLEAN WATER GRANTS PRIORITY LIST FOR F.Y. 1976-77

WHEREAS:


1. At its February 25, 1977, meeting, the Central Valley Regional Water Quality Control Board adopted an amendment to the Water Quality Control Plan, Tulare Lake Basin (5D), which prohibits the discharge of waste from new individual waste disposal systems subsequent to State Board approval of the amendment and prohibits the discharge of waste from existing systems after January 1, 1981, within the Home Garden area, Community Services District, Kings County.
2. These prohibitions are reasonable and necessary in light of the evidence of a serious health hazard resulting from the use of individual disposal systems in the area.
3. A Step I project for Kings County was placed on the Clean Water Grants Priority List for F.Y. 1976-77.
4. The facilities plan for the Home Garden area, Community Services District, has shown that a community collection system discharging to the Hanford Sewage Treatment Plant is the most appropriate method of controlling wastes to protect water quality and public health.
5. Construction of the proposed project without Clean Water Grant funding would place a severe financial hardship on the community.

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED:

1. That the State Board approves Order No. 77-20 of the Central Valley Regional Water Quality Control Board amending the Water Quality Control Plan, Tulare Lake Basin (5D).
2. That the State Board waives Sections 2108(b)(2)(B) and 2108(f) of the Clean Water Grant Regulations.
3. That the F.Y. 1976-77 Clean Water Grants Priority List be amended to add the Home Garden area, Community Services District, Kings County, wastewater collection project to Priority Class B.
