STATE WATER RESOURCES CONTROL BOARD RESOLUTION NO. 77-68

APPROVAL OF AN AMENDMENT TO THE WATER QUALITY CONTROL PLAN, SACRAMENTO RIVER, SACRAMENTO-SAN JOAQUIN DELTA, AND SAN JOAQUIN RIVER BASINS (5A, 5B, AND 5C) - REMOVAL OF WOODS CREEK PROHIBITION

WHEREAS:

- At its May 27, 1977, meeting, and after noticing a proposed resolution in its agenda for that meeting, the Central Valley Regional Water Quality Control Board adopted an amendment to the Water Quality control Plan, Sacramento River, Sacramento-San Joaquin Delta, and San Joaquin River Basins, which removes the prohibition of the direct discharge of municipal and industrial wastes into Woods Creek.
- 2. The Regional Board found that removal of the prohibition is appropriate since, as a result of completion of new treatment facilities for Sonora and Jamestown, Woods Creek now has a healthy stream environment, characterized by abundant fish, wildlife, and other aquatic resources, and has an absence of fungus, slimes, and other objectionable growths.
- 3. The State Board concurs with the Regional Board's finding.

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED:

That the State Board approve the amendment to the Water Quality Control Plan for the Sacramento River, Sacramento-San Joaquin Delta, and San Joaquin River Basins adopted by the Central Valley Regional Water Quality Control Board in its Resolution No. 77-97.
