RESOLUTION NO. 77-68

APPROVAL OF AN AMENDMENT TO THE WATER QUALITY CONTROL PLAN,  
SACRAMENTO RIVER, SACRAMENTO-SAN JOAQUIN DELTA, AND SAN JOAQUIN  
RIVER BASINS (5A, 5B, AND 5C) - REMOVAL OF WOODS CREEK PROHIBITION

WHEREAS:

1. At its May 27, 1977, meeting, and after noticing a proposed resolution in its agenda for that meeting, the Central Valley Regional Water Quality Control Board adopted an amendment to the Water Quality control Plan, Sacramento River, Sacramento-San Joaquin Delta, and San Joaquin River Basins, which removes the prohibition of the direct discharge of municipal and industrial wastes into Woods Creek.
2. The Regional Board found that removal of the prohibition is appropriate since, as a result of completion of new treatment facilities for Sonora and Jamestown, Woods Creek now has a healthy stream environment, characterized by abundant fish, wildlife, and other aquatic resources, and has an absence of fungus, slimes, and other objectionable growths.
3. The State Board concurs with the Regional Board's finding.

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED:

That the State Board approve the amendment to the Water Quality Control Plan for the Sacramento River, Sacramento-San Joaquin Delta, and San Joaquin River Basins adopted by the Central Valley Regional Water Quality Control Board in its Resolution No. 77-97.
