RESOLUTION NO. 77-85

CERTIFYING THE PHASE II PORTION OF THE 208 WORKPLAN OF THE SOUTHERN CALIFORNIA ASSOCIATION OF GOVERNMENTS

WHEREAS:

- 1. The Board, on January 22, 1976, adopted Resolution No. 76-1 designating the boundaries of the South Coast 208 Planning Area and the Southern California Association of Governments as the planning agency for such area.
- 2. On May 6, 1976, the Board adopted Resolution No. 76-40 "Approving the Response of the Southern California Association of Governments to the Board's Conditions of Designation as a 208 Planning Agency" and authorized submittal of the South Coast 208 designation to EPA for approval.
- 3. On October 21, 1976, the Board adopted Resolution No. 76-109 certifying Phase I of the Southern California Association of Governments workplan (Work Tasks 100 to 1000) and authorized submittal to EPA for approval.
- 4. On September 2 , 1977, the Southern California Association of Governments submitted a revised Phase II portion of the workplan (Work Tasks 1100 to 1800) to the Board which describes the work program to be undertaken during the next year to continue developing an areawide plan for the South Coast Area.
- 5. Federal regulations require the Board to certify or refuse to certify that the workplans of designated 208 planning agencies meet four specific tests identified in the federal regulations.
- 6. The Board has considered the recommendations of the staffs of the California Regional Water Quality Control Boards, Los Angeles, Santa Ana, and San Diego Regions, the Air Resources Board, the Office of Planning and Research, and other interested agencies with regard to certification of the subject workplan.

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED:

That the Board certifies, with respect to the Southern California Association of Governments 208 workplan, that:

- The proposed work complies with state requirements;
- b. The proposed planning work program is adequate and necessary to accomplish the development of a plan under Section 208;
- c. Insofar as is known, planning will not duplicate the facilities planning requirement of federal regulations; and
- d. The workplan should be approved by EPA.
