RESOLUTION NO. 78-13

AUTHORIZING NEGOTIATION AND EXECUTION OF AN
AGREEMENT WITH CALTRANS FOR A STUDY OF THE
IMPACTS OF RECREATIONAL VEHICLE WASTES ON
SMALL TREATMENT SYSTEMS AND GROUNDWATERS

WHEREAS:


1. Recreational vehicles' sewage holding tank wastes have caused problems in septic tanks and small aerobic treatment systems.
2. The San Diego Regional Water Quality Control Board has identified this as a significant problem needing study and other Regional Boards have confirmed that it is a problem in many areas of the State.
3. The California Department of Transportation (Caltrans) has identified this as a problem at highway rest stops and is requesting federal funds to study solutions to the problem.

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED:

1. The State Board will join with Caltrans to study the problem; and
2. The Executive Director is authorized to negotiate and execute an agreement with Caltrans for a study of the impacts of recreational vehicle wastes on small treatment systems and groundwaters in an amount not to exceed \$40,000 and a duration of two years.
