STATE WATER RESOURCES CONTROL BOARD RESOLUTION NO. 78-17

AUTHORIZING NEGOTIATION AND EXECUTION OF A CONTRACT TO STUDY THE DILUTION AND MOVEMENT OF POINT SOURCE EFFLUENT DISCHARGES AFFECTING SAN FRANCISCO BAY SHELLFISH BEDS

WHEREAS:

- 1. The California Regional Water Quality Control Board, San Francisco Bay Region, has identified shellfishing as a beneficial use of San Francisco Bay in the Basin Plan.
- The large shellfish resource of San Francisco Bay is currently little used because of existing or potential pollution from point and nonpoint sources of pollution.
- 3. The Regional Board has adopted a "Program to Open San Francisco Bay Shellfish Beds for Direct Recreational Use" which requires a study of the dilution and movement of wastewater effluent to determine its effects on shellfish in an area being studied for possible recreational use.

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED:

That the Executive Director be authorized to negotiate and execute a contract to study the dilution and movement of effluent in an area of San Francisco Bay, for a duration of nine (9) months, in an amount not to exceed \$46,000.
