RESOLUTION NO. 78-17

AUTHORIZING NEGOTIATION AND EXECUTION OF A  
CONTRACT TO STUDY THE DILUTION AND MOVEMENT  
OF POINT SOURCE EFFLUENT DISCHARGES  
AFFECTING SAN FRANCISCO BAY SHELLFISH BEDS

WHEREAS:

1. The California Regional Water Quality Control Board, San Francisco Bay Region, has identified shellfishing as a beneficial use of San Francisco Bay in the Basin Plan.
2. The large shellfish resource of San Francisco Bay is currently little used because of existing or potential pollution from point and nonpoint sources of pollution.
3. The Regional Board has adopted a "Program to Open San Francisco Bay Shellfish Beds for Direct Recreational Use" which requires a study of the dilution and movement of wastewater effluent to determine its effects on shellfish in an area being studied for possible recreational use.

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED:

That the Executive Director be authorized to negotiate and execute a contract to study the dilution and movement of effluent in an area of San Francisco Bay, for a duration of nine (9) months, in an amount not to exceed \$46,000.
