RESOLUTION NO. 78-23

AUTHORIZING NEGOTIATION AND EXECUTION OF AN  
INTERAGENCY AGREEMENT WITH THE DEPARTMENT  
OF FISH AND GAME FOR OPERATION OF THE  
MARINE MONITORING PROGRAM

WHEREAS:


1. Provisions of PL 92-500 and of the Porter-Cologne Act require the State Board to establish and coordinate a statewide water quality surveillance and monitoring program, including the marine environment, to measure compliance with state and federal water quality control programs.
2. The State Board adopted Resolution No. 77-24 on March 17, 1977, authorizing the development and operation of the marine monitoring program by the Department of Fish and Game during F. Y. 1977-1978.
3. The State Board resolved in Resolution No. 78-2, adopted January 19, 1978, approving the revised "Ocean Plan" that "The Board hereby declares its intent to require continual monitoring of the marine environment to assure that the Plan reflects the latest available data and that the water quality objectives fully protect the marine environment."
4. The Department of Fish and Game and its cooperators have qualified personnel and facilities to operate the marine program.

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED:

That the State Board's Executive Director be authorized to negotiate and execute an Interagency Agreement, substantially as proposed, with the Department of Fish and Game for operation of the Marine Water Quality Monitoring Program through June 30, 1979, at a cost not to exceed \$195,000.
