RESOLUTION NO. 79- 44

AMENDING FLOW LIMIT FOR EL TORO WATER
DISTRICT IN ALISO WASTEWATER MANAGE-
MENT AGENCY CLEAN WATER GRANT CONTRACT

WHEREAS:

1. The State Board on February 17, 1977, approved a special grant condition establishing flow limits for the individual members of the Aliso Wastewater Management Agency (AWMA), and that special condition was included in the concept approval awarded to AWMA, dated August 8, 1977; and,
2. The intent of that special condition was to mitigate anticipated adverse air quality impacts associated with rapid growth facilitated by the grant project; and,
3. At the time when the flow limit for the El Toro Water District was calculated, flows per capita for existing dwellings were underestimated, occupancy rates assigned to future dwelling units were incorrect, and some existing units were not counted; and,
4. The correction of these errors and amendment of the flow limit for El Toro Water District will not affect air quality or in any way interfere with the purposes of the special grant conditions, because the amended flow limit will not accommodate more growth than the State Board intended to allow when the condition was adopted; and
5. The staff of the Air Resources Board has concurred with the above findings and has no objection to the amendment of the flow limit for the El Toro Water District.


THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED:

That the State Board hereby approves amendment of the special grant condition for the Aliso Wastewater Management Agency to increase the flow limit for the El Toro Water District from 3.47 MGD to 4.27 MGD and to adjust the total flow limit for the Aliso Wastewater Management Agency as appropriate.
