STATE WATER RESOURCES CONTROL BOARD RESOLUTION NO.80-43

AUTHORIZING THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR TO ENTER INTO AN AGREEMENT WITH THE STATE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH SERVICES TO PERFORM WORK CONSISTENT WITH HAZARDOUS WASTES WORKPLAN FOR PHASE II 208 PLANNING

WHEREAS:

- 1. The State Board has received a grant offer from the Federal Environmental Protection Agency to conduct water quality management planning pursuant to Section 208 of the Federal Clean Water Act.
- On September 20, 1979, the State Board adopted Resolution No. 79-78, Approval of Workplan for Phase II 208 Planning.
- 3. EPA has approved a grant to support the State Board's Phase II 208 Planning Budget which included an allocation of \$443,000 for the hazardous wastes workplan.
- 4. Under the provisions of the Hazardous Waste Control Act of 1972, the Department of Health Services is responsible for the regulation of hazardous wastes in California to safeguard public health, livestock, wildlife, and the environment.
- 5. The Department of Health Services has been designated as the state agency responsible for hazardous waste planning and management under the Federal Resource Conservation and Recovery Act of 1976 (RCRA).
- 6. The funds supplied to the Department of Health Services will enable them to expand their current investigations of abandoned hazardous waste sites to include agricultural counties.
- 7. The information resulting from the investigation will assist the Regional Boards in their control of waste disposal sites to protect water quality.

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED:

That the Board authorizes the Executive Director to enter into an agreement with the Department of Health Services for \$363,000 to perform work consistent with hazardous wastes workplan for Phase II 208 Planning.
