# STATE WATER RESOURCES CONTROL BOARD RESOLUTION NO. 80-85

REVISION OF PRIORITIES FOR PHASE IV 208 PLANNING PROPOSALS - NORTH COAST PESTICIDES, MINING, AND ELKHORN SLOUGH BASIN MANAGEMENT

### WHEREAS:

- 1. The State Water Resources Control Board, on September 10, 1980, established priorities for 23 Phase IV 208 planning project proposals.
- 2. Three of the planning project proposals, North Coast Pesticides, Mining, and Elkhorn Slough Basin Management. were assigned equal priority and the State Board indicated that these projects would be reevaluated and priorities determined in the event funding became available.
- 3. EPA, on October 16, 1980, notified the Board that ten projects on the Board's Phase IV 208 planning project list were tentatively approved.
- 4. On October 28, 1980, EPA took action that made approximately, \$150,000 available to fund all or a portion of the Priority No. 11 projects on the State's Phase IV 208 Project Priority List.
- 5. Priority No. 11. project proposals for the North Coast Pesticides Project, Mining Project, and the Elkhorn Slough Basin Management Project have been revised in scope so as to be consistent with the available funding.
- 6. The State Board has carefully considered the merits of each project proposal.

## THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED:

### That the Board:

- 1. Assigns the following priority to the North Coast Pesticides, Mining, and Elkhorn Slough Basin Management project proposals.
  - A. North Coast Pesticides (Region 1)
  - B. Mining (Region 5)
  - C. Elkhorn Slough Basin Management (AMBAG)
- 2. Authorizes the Executive Director to notify EPA of the State Board's decision to fund the Phase IV 208 North Coast Pesticides project proposed by the North Coast Regional Water Quality Control Board if funds become available.
