RESOLUTION NO. 82-13

CITY OF LOMPOC EAST-WEST INTERCEPTOR FUNDING

WHEREAS:

- 1. The City of Lompoc has requested immediate Step 3 grant funding for the proposed \$1.0 million East-West Interceptor.
- The proposed project does not solve an existing public health or water quality problem, but is planned to accommodate population growth as a result of expanded federal programs at Vandenburg Air Force Base.
- 3. The proposed project does not meet the minimum qualifications under Section 3621, Subchapter 13, Chapter 4 of the California Administrative Code for placement in a fundable Priority Class (Class A, B, or C on the FY 1981 Priority List).
- 4. The State Water Resources Control Board has obligated all of its Clean Water Grant funds and about \$366 million in projects in Classes A, B, and C are already awaiting funds.
- 5. The San Luis Obispo-Central Coast Regional Water Quality Control Board has expressed support for the project, but believes there are more serious water pollution problems within the Region that should be funded before this project.

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED THAT:

- The Board deny the City's request to be placed on the FY 1981 Clean Water Grant Priority List.
- 2. The Board, in accordance with Section 3621 of the State Regulations, place the East-West Interceptor project in Priority Class E, unscheduled on the FY 1983 Clean Water Grant Priority List.
