## STATE WATER RESOURCES CONTROL BOARD RESOLUTION NO. 84-8

# APPROVING COMPLETION OF THE SHASTA KING MINE COMPLEX PHASE II 208 STUDY

#### WHEREAS:

- 1. The California Regional Water Quality Control Board, Central Valley Region, (Regional Board) received Phase II 208 grant funds to conduct acid mine drainage abatement studies, and
- 2. One of these studies was to investigate abatement strategies to control acid drainage from Balaklala, Keystone, and Shasta King Mine portals, and
- 3. The Department of Water Resources (DWR) was awarded a contract to analyze drainage water quality which is included in their final report, "Quantification of Acid and Heavy Metal Discharges from Mine Portals and Dumps at Balaklala, Keystone and Shasta King Mines", and
- 4. Advanced Environmental Consultant (AEC) was awarded a contract to develop acid drainage control strategies, and their findings and recommendations are included in their final report, "Control of Acid and Heavy Metal Discharge from Balaklala, Keystone, and Shasta King Mine Sites", and
- 5. The Regional Board approved these reports at their October 28, 1983 Board meeting by adopting Resolution 83-136, and
- 6. The State Board has considered these reports at their January 19, 1984 Board meeting.

### THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED:

- That the State Board approve the DWR final report, "Quantification of Acid and Heavy Metal Discharges from Mine Portals and Dumps at Balaklala, Keystone and Shasta King Mines," and the AEC final report, "Control of Acid and Heavy Metal Discharge from Balaklala, Keystone, and Shasta King Mines Sites," as completing their contract requirements, and
- 2. That the State Board certifies the BMPs contained in the AEC final report.
- 3. That the State Board directs the Executive Director to transmits the reports to the U. S. Environmental Protection Agency requesting their approval.
