STATE WATER RESOURCES CONTROL BOARD RESOLUTION NO. 84 - 56

ADOPTION OF FY 1985 CLEAN WATER GRANT PROJECT PRIORITY LIST AND MANAGEMENT STRATEGY FOR PROJECT FUNDING IN FY 1985

WHEREAS:

- 1. The Division of Water Quality has proposed a FY 1985 Project Priority List based on Regional Board and public input consistent with the 1981 Amendments to the Clean Water Act.
- 2. In addition to new awards, there is a need to provide funding for reasonable and necessary grant increases in FY 1985.
- A number of communities in Class B have completed all the program requirements, but the lack of sufficient federal funds has delayed grant award.
- 4. Federal regulations (40 CFR 35.1533-4) require that construction grants under Section 201(g)(1) of the Federal Water Pollution Control Act be made only to designated management agencies for construction of treatment works in conformity with approved water quality management plans.

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED:

- The FY 1985 Priority List as proposed by the Division of Water Quality is adopted.
- 2. The fundable portion of the FY 1985 List will include \$275 million for Priority Class A and Class B grantees.
- The staff recommendation to have \$75 million (EPA dollars) in grant increases compete with new awards on a "first come - first served" basis in FY 1985 is approved.
- 4. The staff recommendation to place three Class B projects, totaling about \$18 million, on the contingency list for funding, if additional federal funds become available, is adopted.
- 5. In order to comply with Section 208(d) of the Federal Water Pollution Control Act, all agencies listed on the FY 1985 Priority List are hereby designated as management agencies pursuant to 40 CFR 35.1533-4 for the purpose of construction of treatment works under Section 201(g)(1) of the Act.
