STATE WATER RESOURCES CONTROL BOARD RESOLUTION NO. 84-74

AUTHORIZING THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR TO ENTER INTO AN AGREEMENT WITH THE DEPARTMENT OF WATER RESOURCES FOR CONTINUED TESTING OF THE COORDINATE CHEMICAL BONDING ABSORPTION TREATMENT PROCESS

WHEREAS:

- 1. Assembly Bill 3544 amended the Budget Act of 1984 and reappropriated \$135,000 for continuing the testing of the Coordinate Chemical Bonding Absorption (CCBA) Treatment Process currently being conducted at the Santee Lakes Reclamation Facility for the purpose of determining the feasibility of removing metals, toxics and other pollutants from sewage in the Tijuana River.
- 2. The Department of Water Resources (DWR) had contracted with the San Diego Regional Water Reclamation Agency (SDRWRA) in Fiscal Years 1983 and 1984 to test the CCBA process at the Santee facility.
- 3. The two-year evaluation study by SDRWRA of the CCBA process demonstrated that this treatment system is cost-effective.
- 4. Both DWR and SDRWRA had planned for and requested funds for a third and final year of testing of the CCBA process.
- 5. The DWR has staff already familiar with CCBA program and facilities at Santee.

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED:

That the State Board authorize the Executive Director to execute an interagency agreement with the Department of Water Resources for continued testing of the CCBA process for the purpose of determining the feasibility of removing metals, toxics, and other pollutants from sewage in the Tijuana River and with the addition of a suitable filter system, to produce tertiary effluent meeting Title 22 requirements.
