### STATE WATER RESOURCES CONTROL BOARD

### RESOLUTION NO. 84-87

APPROVING AN EXCEPTION TO THE POLICY LIMITING STEP 1 AND STEP 2 GRANT INCREASES FOR THE MANILA COMMUNITY SERVICES DISTRICT, PROJECT NO. C-06-1304

#### WHEREAS:

- The Manila Community Services District constructed a wastewater collection system and temporary disposal facility in 1979;
- 2. The intended final disposal facilities for the Manila Community Services District, which were to be part of the Regional Wastewater Plant for the Humboldt Bay area, were never constructed;
- 3. A Step 1 grant increase of \$25,000 to study long-term effluent disposal alternatives was approved on February 3, 1983;
- 4. On September 17, 1984, the Division of Water Quality approved the Phase I, Step 1 study dated June 1984, which was funded by the February 3, 1983 increase;
- 5. The report identified the additional tasks needed to complete the Step 1 work;
- 6. The District, by letter dated October 15, 1984, petitioned the State Board for an additional Step 1 grant increase to complete Step 1 and proceed with completion of the project;
- 7. The Community is an economically depressed area which cannot proceed without grant assistance:
- Failure to provide a long-term disposal facility will result in failure of the temporary disposal system and have adverse impacts on public health and the water quality of Humboldt Bay;
- 9. Upon evaluation of the circumstances surrounding the project, it is prudent to fund the remaining Step 1 work;
- 10. A cost savings to the Construction Grants program will result by funding the remaining Step 1 work by grant amendment.

# THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED:

1. That the State Water Resources Control Board approves a one-time Step 1 grant increase of up to \$28,200 for the Manila Community Services District to complete the Step 1 work.
