STATE WATER RESOURCES CONTROL BOARD RESOLUTION NO. 85-2

CERTIFYING THE FINAL REPORTS OF THE SOUTHERN CALIFORNIA HAZARDOUS WASTE MANAGEMENT PROJECT

WHEREAS:

- 1. Pursuant to the terms of a Phase IV 208 grant from the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA), the State Water Resources Control Board (State Board) provided funds to the California Department of Health Services (DHS) to conduct the Southern California Hazardous Waste Management Project (SCHWMP).
- 2. DHS has completed the SCHWMP and has submitted the following final reports:
 - a. <u>Final Report on Phase I Activities</u>, January 31, 1984 (2 volumes)
 - b. Residuals Repository Conceptual Design and Feasibility Study, February 1984
 - c. Hazardous Waste Incineration Feasibility Study, May 1984
- 3. The State Board is required by 40 CFR 35.1523 to evaluate all 208 products, to certify, or not to certify them as being in accordance with the evaluation criteria specified in 40 CFR 35.1523, and to inform EPA as to its findings.
- 4. The State Board has found that the above final reports conform to the criteria for certification.
- 5. The findings and conclusions of the SCHWMP are general insofar as they do not recommend any specific hazardous waste management facilities.
- 6. Certification of the products of the SCHWMP will complete this Phase IV 208 project.

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED:

- 1. That the State Board certifies the final reports of the Southern California Hazardous Waste Management Project as meeting the evaluation criteria for 208 products.
- 2. That any future State Board or Regional Water Quality Control Board decisions on specific hazardous waste management proposals will be made independently of this certification.



3. That the Executive Director shall transmit this certification to the Regional Administrator of EPA, Region 9.
