Campos supervised the major review of Sacramento-San Joaquin Delta water quality standards that established fair and equitable ground rules for protection and use of water from California's most important water resource, resolving long-standing impasses that blocked resolution of water resource problems, and

WHEREAS, Michael Campos was Chief of the Basin Planning Unit that directed and oversaw the development of water quality control plans for each water basin in California, an effort that has proven of immeasureable worth in guiding the program for the protection of water quality in California, and

WHEREAS, Michael A. Campos brought expertise as an engineer and as an attorney to the problems he confronted in his responsibilities with the Water Board, giving his leadership a unique and valuable dimension, and

WHEREAS, Michael A. Campos is leaving the Water Resources Control Board after a distinguished fourteen-year career of increasingly important assignments and challenges, and

WHEREAS, Michael A. Campos will enter into the practice of law with the firm of Baker, Manock and Jensen, one of the oldest and largest law firms in Fresno, California, and

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED: That the Members of the Water Resources Control Board, as individuals and on behalf of the people of California, heartily express appreciation to Michael A. Campos for his significant contributions to building a safe and plentiful water supply for California, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED: That the Water Resources Control Board wishes Michael A. Campos a fulfilling legal career, personal happiness and a long life.
