

CLOSE-OUT OF THE FEDERAL SECTION 208
AREAWIDE WASTE TREATMENT MANAGEMENT PLANNING
PROGRAM GRANTS FOR CALIFORNIA

WHEREAS:

- 1. Section 208 of the Federal Water Pollution Control Act, and subsequently of the Clean Water Act, gave authority to the U. S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) to provide grants to states for areawide waste treatment management planning.
- 2. The State Water Resources Control Board (State Board) was designated by former Governor Ronald Reagan on June 26, 1973 as the agency empowered to administer the Section 208 planning program in California.
- 3. Projects performed under the four phases of the Section 208 planning program in California have been completed and submitted to the State Board for approval, and the project products have been transmitted to EPA for acceptance.
- 4. Completion of the Section 208 funded planning activities in California does not divest the State Board from managing the State's water quality control program, including those developed under Section 208 planning.
- 5. Attachment Nos. 1 and 2 to this resolution summarize the projects completed under the four phases of Section 208 as well as the products delivered.
- 6. In accordance with a written request of August 16, 1985 from EPA, the State Board has compiled a summary of information for all projects performed under Phases I through IV of the Section 208 planning program in California and is in the process of completing Financial Status Reports for the non-designated area projects.

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED:

That the State Board authorizes the Executive Director to request close-out from EPA of the Section 208 Areawide Waste Treatment Management Planning Program grants for California and to submit the summary information, including Financial Status Reports, to EPA as documentation of completion of the State's 208 planning program activities performed under the Phase I through Phase IV grants.
