STATE WATER RESOURCES CONTROL BOARD RESOLUTION NO. 86-8

RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING CHAIRMAN RAYMOND V. STONE, ON BEHALF OF THE STATE WATER RESOURCES CONTROL BOARD (STATE BOARD), TO SIGN THE PROPOSED MEMORANDUM OF AGREEMENT (MOA) WITH THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH SERVICES (DHS) REGARDING IMPLEMENTATION OF THE HAZARDOUS WASTE PROGRAM AND DIRECTING THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR OF THE STATE BOARD TO FORWARD THE SIGNED MOA TO DHS

WHEREAS:

- 1. DHS is the lead State agency for administering a hazardous waste control program equivalent to the federal hazardous waste management system established under the Resource Conservation and Recovery Act (RCRA) in California and receives federal grant funds to carry out that program.
- 2. The MOA provides for DHS and the State Board to develop an interagency agreement in order for the State Board to receive reimbursement in fulfillment of their responsibilities under the MOA.
- 3. The State Board has the authority to implement and enforce the Porter-Cologne Water Quality Control Act, Water Code, Division 7; Article 9.5 of Chapter 6.5 of Division 20 of the Health and Safety Code (HSC) (Hazardous Waste Control Law); and to develop standards for local implementation and enforcement of Chapter 6.7 (Underground Storage of Hazardous Sustances) of Division 20 of the HSC.
- 4. The State Board has promulgated regulations which establish, in detail, water quality protection standards for discharges of waste to land, California Administrative Code, Title 23, Chapter 3, Subchapter 15.
- 5. The State Board has regulations governing other discharges of waste which could affect the quality of waters of the State and regulations implementing Chapter 6.7 of Division 20 of of the HSC.
- 6. An existing "Memorandum of Agreement Between the Department of Health Services and the State Water Resources Control Board on Implementation of the Hazardous Waste Program Required by the Resource Conservation and Recovery Act (RCRA)" was signed on December 31, 1982.
- 7. A revised MOA is necessary to address changes in program development which have occurred during the last three years.
- 8. The attached revised MOA states the authority which the State Board and DHS have to implement and enforce the State's Hazardous Waste Program.



THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED:

That the State Board authorizes Chairman Raymond Stone to sign the revised MOA with DHS regarding implementation of the Hazardous Waste Program and directs the Executive Director to forward the signed MOA to DHS.
