STATE WATER RESOURCES CONTROL BOARD RESOLUTION NO. 86-24

REDIRECTION OF STATE ASSISTANCE PROGRAM (SAP) FUNDS FOR PARTICIPATION IN CONTINUING RESEARCH TO REMOVE SELENIUM FROM AGRICULTURAL DRAIN WATER USING A BIOLOGICAL PROCESS

WHEREAS:

- 1. The Clean Water and Water Conservation Bond Law of 1978 (Proposition 2) contained provisions for the expenditure of up to \$50 million to fund water pollution control, water conservation and wastewater reclamation needs in the State.
- The State Water Resources Control Board (State Board) designated the disbursement of Proposition 2 grant funds as the State Assistance Program (SAP).
- 3. There are about \$427,000 from SAP Grant savings that are currently unencumbered and available for redirection by the State Board.
- 4. The proposed interagency research proposal is a wastewater project and thus eligible for funding under the SAP.
- 5. The Department of Water Resources will be the project manager for this \$200,000 interagency research proposal, i.e. \$50,000, State Board; \$50,000, Department of Water Resources; \$100,000, Department of Fish and Game.

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED THAT THE STATE BOARD:

- 1. Approves redirection of \$50,000 from SAP grant savings to find a short-term interagency research proposal to participate in continuing research to remove selenium from agricultural drain water using a biological process.
- 2. Authorizes the Executive Director or his designee to negotiate and execute a contract with the Department of Water Resources at a total cost not to exceed \$50,000.
