STATE WATER RESOURCES CONTROL BOARD RESOLUTION NO. 87- 73

ADOPTION OF THE POLICY REGARDING THE REGULATION OF UNDERGROUND STORAGE TANKS WHEREAS:

- The State Water Resources Control Board (State Board) and Regional Water Quality Control Boards (Regional Boards) rely on a legislatively established surcharge on underground storage tank permit fees to fund staff implementation of the underground storage tank law and regulations.
- 2. Delay in or failure to collect and transmit the State surcharge by the local implementing agencies impedes State and Regional Board implementation of the underground storage tank law.
- 3. The roles of the State Board, Regional Boards, and local implementing agencies in ensuring proper and timely cleanup of the effects of leaking underground storage tanks need to be defined.
- 4. Statewide guidance and technical assistance are needed to ensure consistent evaluation and appropriate cleanup at leaking underground storage tank sites, regardless of which agency is overseeing the cleanup effort.
- Local supervision of soil and ground water cleanup by responsible parties at leaking underground storage tank sites is desirable.

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED:

- 1. That the State Board adopts the policy regarding the regulation of underground storage tanks.
- 2. That the State Board directs the Executive Director or his designee to take actions needed to implement the policy.
