STATE WATER RESOURCES CONTROL BOARD RESOLUTION NO. 87-84

AUTHORIZING NEGOTIATION AND EXECUTION OF CONTRACTS WITH SELECTED LOCAL IMPLEMENTING AGENCIES FOR USE OF U. S. ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION AGENCY (EPA) PETROLEUM TRUST FUND AND THE STATE HAZARDOUS SUBSTANCE CLEANUP BOND FUND TO OVERSEE LEAKING UNDERGROUND STORAGE TANK (UST) SITE INVESTIGATION AND CLEANUP

WHEREAS:

- 1. Leaking UST sites require cleanup to protect drinking water supplies and other beneficial uses of ground and surface waters.
- The State Board policy on USTs encourages local implementing agencies to play a strong role in supervising the investigation and cleanup of leaking USTs.
- 3. Federal Petroleum Trust Fund and State Hazardous Substance Cleanup Bond Fund monies are available for local agency supervision of leaking UST site investigation and cleanup.
- 4. The State Board shall select only those local implementing agencies for participation in the Pilot Program which, unless exempted, have implemented the provisions of Chapter 6.7 of the Health and Safety Code and which, unless exempted, have begun to collect and transmit to the State Board the surcharge fees pursuant to subdivision (b) of Section 25287.
- 5. The State Board shall not enter into an agreement with a local implementing agency for soil contamination cleanup or for groundwater contamination cleanup unless the State Board determines that the local implementing agency has demonstrated capability to oversee cleanup.

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED:

That the State Board authorizes the Executive Director or his designee to negotiate and execute contracts and amendments thereto with selected local implementing agencies for an amount not to exceed \$10.7 million in Fiscal Year 1987-88 for supervising leaking UST site assessment, investigation, and cleanup, subject to availability of funds. The Executive Director shall not execute contracts with local implementing agencies which have not begun remitting the surcharge fees.
