STATE WATER RESOURCES CONTROL BOARD RESOLUTION NO. 87-93

APPROVAL OF AMENDMENT TO THE SOUTH BAY MULTI-SITE COOPERATIVE AGREEMENT (MSCA) BETWEEN THE STATE WATER RESOURCES CONTROL BOARD AND THE U. S. ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION AGENCY (EPA)

WHEREAS:

- 1. The issue of ground water contamination and the need for remedial action and cleanup in the South Bay area is of critical importance in relation to the threat this situation poses to beneficial uses of ground water especially in regard to human health.
- The South Bay is part of a large area where approximately 1.5 million residents rely on ground water to supply 50 percent of their drinking water.
- 3. The San Francisco Bay Regional Board has, since late 1981, been involved in the implementation of a State effort to address water quality issues resulting from leaking underground tanks.
- 4. The EPA has requested cooperation from the State Board and the San Francisco Bay Regional Board in implementing the South Bay MSCA program. EPA also supports amendment of the program through December 31, 1987 to complete scheduled work projects.

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED:

- 1. That the State Board approve this amendment in order for the San Francisco Bay Regional Board to complete current programs in the South Bay MSCA.
- 2. That the State Board authorize the Executive Director or his designee to execute an agreement with the EPA to implement an amendment to the South Bay MSCA.
