# STATE WATER RESOURCES CONTROL BOARD RESOLUTION NO. 88-47

## AMENDMENT TO THE SUBSECTION 205(j)(2) PHASE IV IMPLEMENTATION PLAN

#### WHEREAS:

- The State Water Resources Control Board (State Board) adopted Resolution No. 87-108 on December 17, 1987 approving an Implementation Plan for the Phase IV Subsection 205(j)(2) Program.
- 2. Through the State Board's budgetary process, Subsection 205(j)(2) funds were identified as the funding source to be set aside for:

a. Bay-Delta Estuary Program \$730,000 b. Marine Bioassay Project \$150,000 \$880,000

- 3. Based on guidance from the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA), the State Board has determined that the 40 percent mandated allocation (minimum) to Regional Public Comprehensive Planning Organizations and Interstate Organizations of Subsection 205(j)(2) funds applies to federal appropriations beginning with federal fiscal year (FFY) 1988.
- 4. The State Board may elect to fund from FFY 1989 205(j)(2) monies additional important water quality management planning projects submitted to the State Board during the Phase IV solicitation process.
- 5. The Implementation Plan adopted on December 17, 1987 did not specifically provide for item Nos. 2, 3, and 4 above.

#### THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED:

#### That the State Board:

- Adopts the attached amendment to the Phase IV Subsection 205(j)(2) Implementation Plan in order to:
  - a. State the State Board's intent to set aside a total of \$880,000 for the following State Board projects:

Bay-Delta Estuary Program \$730,000 Marine Bioassay Project \$150,000 \$880,000

b. Clarify that the mandated allocation of 40 percent of the Phase IV 205(j)(2) funds will apply to only the FFY 1988 monies.

- c. Retain the option for the State Board to allocate FFY 1989 205(j)(2) funds to projects selected and prioritized during the Phase IV process.
- Authorizes staff to submit the Plan amendments to EPA for approval.
