STATE WATER RESOURCES CONTROL BOARD RESOLUTION NO. 88-62

ADOPTION OF CLEAN WATER GRANT AND STATE REVOLVING FUND (SRF) LOAN PROGRAM FUNDING STRATEGIES FOR FEDERAL FISCAL YEAR (FFY) 1989

WHEREAS:

- 1. The State Board has established October 1, 1988, as the date for implementing the SRF loan program.
- There are at least 35 projects on the FFY 1988 Priority List totaling \$101 million which may not make the September 30, 1988 deadline for grant funding. This may result in unexpended funds being available at the end of the fiscal year.
- 3. There are many small communities that cannot afford to construct their projects without grant assistance.
- 4. There are many communities that have expended significant amounts of local money preparing their project for the grant program that would lose their investment if grant funding was not given.
- 5. Three alternative programs have been analyzed for commitment of unobligated FFY 1988 grant funds.

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT IN THE EVENT THERE ARE UNOBLIGATED FFY 1988 GRANT FUNDS, THAT:

- 1. Subject to meeting public hearing requirements and obtaining Environmental Protection Agency approval, the State Board tentatively approves:
 - (a) Extension of the grant program to June 30, 1989 by extending the existing FFY 1988 Clean Water Grant Priority List to June 30, 1989.
 - (b) Retention of the \$25 million funding cap for those projects receiving grants from the extended FFY 1988 list.
 - (c) Reservation of \$20 million to be set aside for Class A projects only. On May 1, 1989, any remaining funds in the reserve will be made available to all projects on the fundable portion of the list.
- 2. A new FFY 1989 SRF Loan Program Priority List be established for the issuance of loan assistance beginning on October 1, 1988.
