## STATE WATER RESOURCES CONTROL BOARD RESOLUTION NO. 88-83

AUTHORIZING NEGOTIATION AND EXECUTION OF A CONTRACT WITH STANISLAUS COUNTY FOR USE OF U.S. ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION AGENCY (EPA) TRUST FUND FOR LEAKING UNDERGROUND STORAGE TANKS AND THE STATE HAZARDOUS SUBSTANCE CLEANUP BOND FUND TO OVERSEE LEAKING UNDERGROUND STORAGE TANK SITE INVESTIGATION AND CLEANUP

## WHEREAS:

- Leaking underground storage tank sites require cleanup to protect drinking water supplies and other beneficial uses of ground and surface waters.
- The State Board policy on underground storage tanks encourages local implementing agencies to play a strong role in supervising the investigation and cleanup of leaking underground storage tanks.
- 3. The State Board has requested that \$415,415 in Federal Trust Fund for Leaking Underground Storage Tanks and State Hazardous Substance cleanup Bond Fund monies be carried over to the Fiscal Year (FY) 1988-89 budget for Stanislaus county.
- Stanislaus County is seeking to receive funds for oversight of investigation and cleanup at leaking underground storage tank sites.
- 5. Stanislaus County has an active underground storage tank program under Chapter 6.7 of the Health and Safety Code and has remitted surcharges pursuant to that division. Stanislaus County has also demonstrated that it has the capability to oversee investigation and cleanup of leaking underground storage tank sites.

## THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED;

That the State Water Resources Control Board authorizes the Executive Director, or his designee, to negotiate and execute a contract and amendments thereto with Stanislaus county for an amount not to exceed \$415,415 in FY 1988-89 for overseeing investigation and cleanup of leaking underground storage tank sites, subject to availability of funds.
