STATE WATER RESOURCES CONTROL BOARD RESOLUTION NO. 88-133

FINDING THAT ADDITIONAL TIME IS NECESSARY TO PROCESS APPLICATION 27883 PURSUANT TO WATER CODE SECTION 1250.5

WHEREAS:

- 1. Applicant has filed Application 27883 to appropriate 50 cfs from Wallace Canyon Creek, tributary to Long Canyon Creek in Placer County, subject to the provisions of Water Code Section 1250.5.
- 2. The geologic hazards analysis and the Draft Environmental Impact Report for the project are incomplete, so the Board cannot determine the effect upon instream uses within the initial one-year period which expires December 15, 1988.

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED:

- 1. That the State Water Resources Control Board finds that additional time is necessary to process Application 27883 and determine the effect upon instream uses pursuant to Water Code Section 1250.5.
- 2. That the applicant shall submit to the Board a current specific definition of the project elements and additional information needed to complete the environmental analysis of the project, as defined by the U. S. Forest Service and State Board staff.
- 3. The staff shall schedule further action on this project, including a hearing, if necessary, so that the Board can act upon Application 27883 within 180 days after the Chief, Division of Water Rights, finds the above requirements have been adequately completed.
- 4. If the above requirements are not met by June 15, 1989, the Chief, Division of Water Rights, shall cancel Application 27883 for lack of diligence.
