# STATE WATER RESOURCES CONTROL BOARD RESOLUTION NO. 89-24

ACCEPTANCE OF THE CALIFORNIA REGIONAL WATER QUALITY CONTROL BOARD, SAN FRANCISCO BAY REGION'S 205(j)(2) PHASE II FINAL REPORTS AS COMPLETION OF THE "SAN FRANCISCO BAY GROUND WATER PROTECTION FROM HAZARDOUS SUBSTANCES PROJECT"

#### WHEREAS:

- 1. Pursuant to the terms of the 205(j)(2) Phase II grant from the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA), the State Water Resources Control Board (State Board) provided funds to the California Regional Water Quality Control Board, San Francisco Bay Region (San Francisco Bay Regional Board) to conduct a project entitled "San Francisco Bay Ground Water Protection from Hazardous Substances Project" (Project).
- 2. The San Francisco Bay Regional Board contracted with the University of California, Berkeley, and the Alameda County Flood Control and Water Conservation District to conduct the study.
- 3. The San Francisco Bay Regional Board has accepted and submitted to the State Board the Final Project Reports entitled San Francisco Bay Region Ground Water Resources Study (Volumes 1-10), December 1987, Geohydrology and Groundwater Quality Overview, East Bay Plain Area, Alameda County, California, June 1988, and Geohydrology and Ground Water Quality Overview, East Bay Plain Area, Alameda County, California, Appendix, June 1988.
- 4. The State Board finds that the Final Project Reports conform to the requirements of the EPA 205(j)(2) Phase II grant and workplan.

## THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED:

## That the State Board:

- Accepts the Final Project Reports as completion of the San Francisco Bay Regional Board's 205(j)(2) Phase II Study.
- 2. Authorizes final payment to the District under Standard Agreement No. 6-134-120-0.

3. Directs staff to transmit the Final Project Reports to EPA as completion of the San Francisco Bay Regional Board's Phase II 205(j)(2) Study.
