STATE WATER RESOURCES CONTROL BOARD RESOLUTION NO. 89-54

APPROVAL OF THE REQUEST FOR \$278,800 FROM THE WATER POLLUTION CLEANUP AND ABATEMENT ACCOUNT FOR CLEANUP OF PETROLEUM POLLUTION AT FOUR SITES IN THE NORTH COAST REGION

WHEREAS:

1. The Regional Water Quality Control Board, North Coast Region has requested \$278,800 from the Water Pollution Cleanup and Abatement Account to pay the cost of investigation and cleanup of pollution at four sites in the North Coast Region as described in the Regional Board's funding request. The funding request is allocated among the four sites and Regional Board oversight costs as follows:

a.	\$42,100	Third Street Culvert, Santa Rosa, investigation;
b.	\$67,400	B Street Storm Drain, Santa Rosa, investigation and interim cleanup;
c.	\$67,250	Hollis James property, Loleta, interim cleanup;
d.	\$67,050	Baker's Service Station, Graton, interim cleanup;
e.	\$35,000	Regional Board oversight.

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT THE STATE BOARD:

- 1. Orders that the amount of \$278,800 from the Water Pollution Cleanup and Abatement Account be paid to the Regional Water Quality Control Board, North Coast Region, to be used for the purposes specified in the recitals of this resolution.
- 2. All unexpended funds shall automatically revert to the Water Pollution Cleanup and Abatement Account twelve months from the date of encumbrance, unless a time extension is granted by the Executive Director or designee.
- 3. Upon completion of the work funded under this resolution, the Regional Board shall submit a report to the Office of Chief Counsel describing the work accomplished and discussing any possible recoupment of funds.

4. Any funds which are recouped by the Regional Board shall be returned to the Water Pollution Cleanup and Abatement Account.
