## STATE WATER RESOURCES CONTROL BOARD RESOLUTION NO. 89-58

ADOPTING THE PROPOSED 1989 PRIORITY LIST FOR THE AGRICULTURAL DRAINAGE WATER MANAGEMENT LOAN PROGRAM AND AUTHORIZING LOAN FUNDING FOR BUENA VISTA WATER STORAGE DISTRICT

## WHEREAS:

- Many waters of the State of California have been polluted from agricultural drainage water, and many others are threatened with pollution from agricultural drainage water.
- 2. The people and Legislature of the State of California enacted the Water Conservation and Water Quality Bond Law of 1986 to address the serious hazard to the environment from agricultural drainage water.
- 3. A priority list of projects eligible for funding under the Agricultural Drainage Water Management Loan Program is necessary for the effective implementation of the loan program.
- 4. Panoche Drainage District has applied for a loan to improve water quality in a series of canals in the Grasslands area in western Merced County.
- 5. The City of Riverside and Orange County Water District have applied for loans to treat groundwater contaminated by agricultural drainage water.
- Buena Vista Water Storage District has applied for a loan to investigate and find solutions for the drainage problem within their district.

## THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT THE STATE BOARD:

- 1. Adopts the 1989 Agricultural Drainage Water Management Loan Program Priority List.
- 2. Approves loan funding in the amount of \$100,000 to Buena Vista Water Storage District.

3. Authorizes the Executive Director or his designee to execute, after approval by the State Legislature, for and on behalf of the State board, a contract and amendments thereto with Buena Vista Water Storage District for a loan under the Water Conservation and Water Quality Bond Law of 1986, and to perform all acts and to do all things necessary and convenient to implement such a contract.
