RESOLUTION NO. 89-77

REQUEST FOR AN INCREASE IN THE SUPPLEMENTAL STATE ASSISTANCE
GRANT FOR THE CALAVERAS COUNTY WATER DISTRICT ON BEHALF OF
THE COMMUNITY OF VALLECITO, CLEAN WATER GRANT PROJECT NO. C-06-0850-210

WHEREAS:


1. The State Board approved a supplemental state assistance grant for the Calaveras County Water District on January 21, 1988 in the amount of \$1,016,495;
2. Estimated costs of the proposed project have now risen to about \$5.0 million;
3. For those projects costing more than \$2.5 million, the State Board must make a finding that the project is the most cost-effective solution to the water quality or public health problem;
4. The Division of Loans and Grants has determined that the proposed project is the most cost effective solution to the public health problem;
5. The State Board's Implementation Plan and Policy for the Clean Water Bond Law of 1984 provides that the amount of the supplemental grant be determined by using the formula contained in that document;
6. Calaveras County Water District is requesting an increase of about \$200,000 in their previously approved supplemental state assistance grant of \$1,016,495;
7. The requested supplemental grant will not result in combined federal and state assistance of more than 97.5 percent of the State eligible project cost.

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT THE STATE BOARD:

1. Determines that the Calaveras County Water District is eligible to receive a supplemental state assistance grant under the 1984 Clean Water Bond Law, and that the proposed project is the most cost-effective solution to the public health problem which is involved.
2. Approves the award of a supplemental state assistance grant in the estimated amount of \$1.2 million to the Calaveras County Water District on behalf of the community of Vallecito.
