STATE WATER RESOURCES CONTROL BOARD RESOLUTION NO. 90-40

AUTHORIZING THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR, OR HIS DESIGNEE, TO ACCEPT AND AMEND A CLEAN WATER ACT SECTION 319(h) GRANT FOR NONPOINT SOURCE (NPS)

WHEREAS:

- Section 319(h) of the federal Clean Water Act reserves grant funds for states to implement Nonpoint Source Management Programs.
- 2. The State Water Resources Control Board (State Board) is the designated state agency in California to administer the nonpoint source program.
- 3. The State Board approved a <u>Nonpoint Source Management Plan</u> on November 15, 1988 which includes activities that the State Board and Regional Water Quality Control Boards (Regional Boards) will undertake to manage nonpoint
- Congress directed the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) to seek state grant applications no later than January 16, 1990.
- 5. The State Board submitted a Section 319(h) grant application for \$1.9 million on January 12, 1990.
- Following evaluation by EPA, eleven nonpoint source projects were selected for funding (list attached).
- A total of \$1,675,000 of federal Section 319(h) FFY 1990 is available to the State for nonpoint source implementation and development activities.

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED:

That the State Board authorizes the Executive Director, or his designee, to:

- Accept/amend a FFY 1990 Clean Water Act Section 319(h) grant for an amount up to \$1.675 million for support of the Nonpoint Source Program.
- 2. Approve the final Section 319(h) nonpoint source implementation workplans and to negotiate and execute contracts and amendments in accordance with the workplans to implement the projects.
- Execute, for and on behalf of the State Board and/or Regional Boards, Budget Act certifications regarding electronic data processing expenditures.

 Redirect unexpended Section 319(h) nonpoint source implementation and development funds.
