# STATE WATER RESOURCES CONTROL BOARD RESOLUTION NO. 91-35

## TOXIC PITS CLEANUP ACT OF 1984

#### WHEREAS:

- The Toxic Pits Cleanup Act of 1984 (TPCA) established a program to ensure that existing surface impoundments which contain liquid hazardous wastes are either made safe or closed.
- 2. TPCA contains various deadlines for compliance with its provisions.
- 3. TPCA authorizes regulatory actions to ensure compliance.
- 4. The California Regional Water Quality Control Boards (Regional Boards) have taken appropriate action on most TPCA sites.
- 5. Additional TPCA sites are being addressed adequately under other programs.
- 6. There are a few sites at which further action is needed to ensure compliance.
- 7. The State Water Resources Control Board (State Board) has determined that it is most efficient at this point to assume jurisdiction over these remaining sites.

# THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT THE STATE BOARD:

- 1. On its own motion, assumes jurisdiction, including the authority to issue cleanup and abatement orders, over the sites listed in the Attachment.
- 2. May remand any orders issued to the appropriate Regional Board for implementation.
- Will handle sites being addressed adequately under other programs outside the TPCA program.
