STATE WATER RESOURCES CONTROL BOARD RESOLUTION NO. 91-50

INCREASE IN THE CONSTRUCTION MANAGEMENT ASSISTANCE GRANT (CMAG) FOR FEDERAL FISCAL YEARS (FFY) 1991 AND 1992 FOR WORK ON THE TIJUANA BORDER POLLUTION SANITATION PROBLEMS

WHEREAS:

- The United States Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) is funding the planning, design and construction of projects to resolve a serious water quality problem imposed on California by Tijuana, Mexico.
- 2. The EPA has provided \$95,000 to the State Board for staff technical assistance in the review of planning and design documents related to such projects.
- The EPA has requested an increase in such technical assistance to assure compliance with grant program regulations.
- 4. The increase in technical assistance requested by EPA for FFYs 1991 and 1992 would require funding in the amount of \$227,756.

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT THE STATE BOARD:

- 1. Authorizes the Executive Director to accept an amendment to the CMAG in the amount of \$227,756; and
- 2. Directs the Executive Director and the Chief of the Division of Administrative Services to arrange that funds from the amendment be placed in a reserve account for utilization during FFYs 1991 and 1992.
