STATE WATER RESOURCES CONTROL BOARD RESOLUTION NO. 91-63

REVIEW OF ENFORCEMENT AT TWENTY-SEVEN SITES SUBJECT TO THE TOXIC PITS CLEANUP ACT (TPCA)

WHEREAS:

- 1. The Toxic Pits Cleanup Act of 1984 (TPCA) established a program to ensure that existing surface impoundments which contain liquid hazardous wastes or hazardous wastes containing free liquids are either made safe or closed.
- 2. TPCA contains various deadlines for compliance with its provisions.
- 3. TPCA authorizes regulatory actions to ensure compliance.
- At its May 1, 1991 meeting the State Water Resources Control Board (State Board) assumed regulatory jurisdiction over twenty-seven TPCA sites.
- State Board staff have completed a review of the enforcement actions on each of the twenty-seven TPCA sites.

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT THE STATE BOARD:

 Takes the following actions taken by the applicable Regional Water Quality Control Board (Regional Board) for the TPCA sites listed:
