STATE WATER RESOURCES CONTROL BOARD RESOLUTION NO. 92-83

DELEGATING AUTHORITY TO APPROVE

EMERGENCY, ABANDONED RECALCITRANT (EAR)

ACCOUNT FUNDING UP TO \$100,000 FOR

EMERGENCY UNDERGROUND STORAGE TANK (UST) CLEANUP CASES

WHEREAS:

- Chapter 6.75 of the Health and Safety Code authorizes the State Water Board to provide UST Cleanup Funds to Regional Boards and local UST agencies for direct cleanup of petroleum UST sites requiring emergency or prompt corrective action to protect health and the environment;
- 2. The Emergency, Abandoned, Recalcitrant (EAR) Account (Water Quality Administrative Procedures Manual Chapter 19) was developed to implement this portion of the UST Cleanup Fund Program;
- 3. It is important that EAR Account Funds be approved quickly to handle emergency cleanup at petroleum UST sites:
- \$100,000 is a reasonable limit for emergency cleanup at petroleum UST sites;
- 5. The Chief, Division of Clean Water Programs, the Chief, Division of Administrative Services, the Executive Director, and the Chief Counsel have the resources to determine the merit of an emergency cleanup case.

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT:

The State Water Board delegates the authority to approve EAR Account funds up to \$100,000 per occurrence for emergency UST cleanup cases to the Chief, Division of Clean Water Programs, the Chief, Division of Administrative Services, the Executive Director, and the Chief Counsel, in the order listed.
