## STATE WATER RESOURCES CONTROL BOARD RESOLUTION NO. 94-30

AUTHORIZING THE AMENDMENT OF A CONTRACT BETWEEN THE STATE WATER RESOURCES CONTROL BOARD AND THE CALIFORNIA ASSOCIATION OF ENVIRONMENTAL HEALTH ADMINISTRATORS FOR THE CONTINUED MAINTENANCE, ENHANCEMENT, AND UPDATING OF THE PERMIT APPLICATION DATABASE FOR THE UNDERGROUND STORAGE TANK PROGRAM FOR FISCAL YEAR 1994-95

## WHEREAS:

- 1. The State Water Resources Control Board (SWRCB) is required by law to store underground storage permit application information for the purposes of managing and appropriately cross-referencing and indexing such information;
- 2. The SWRCB has previously been required to contract with the California Association of Environmental Administrators (CAEHA) to maintain the underground storage tank permit information in the Statewide Environmental Evaluation and Planning System (SWEEPS) in accordance with Section 25286(b)(2) of the Health and Safety Code. The law has been changed to allow for outside contracting; and
- 3. The present contract with CAEHA is scheduled to expire June 30, 1994. To enable the SWRCB to seek competitive bids and to enable the existing service to continue without interruption, the SWRCB wishes to extend the contract with the CAEHA for an additional nine (9) months during FY 1994-95.

## THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED:

That the State Water Board authorizes the Executive Director or his designee to amend the existing contract with the CAEHA by extending it for an additional nine months and increasing the present budget \$157,500 for the purpose of maintaining and operating the Underground Storage Tank Permit Information System through March 31, 1995, subject to availability of funds.
