## STATE WATER RESOURCES CONTROL BOARD RESOLUTION NO. 96-037

APPROVAL OF A LINKED DEPOSIT PROGRAM FUNDED THROUGH THE STATE REVOLVING FUND TO ESTABLISH THE LAKE TAHOE BEST MANAGEMENT PRACTICES RETROFIT PROJECT SRF LOAN NO. C-06-6038-11

## WHEREAS:

- The Tahoe Regional Planning Agency (TRPA) and the Lake Tahoe Resources Conservation District have requested funding for a \$3 million Linked Deposit Program funded through the State Revolving Fund (SRF) for a Lake Tahoe Best Management Practices (BMP) Retrofit Project (Project).
- 2. The Project implements recommendations of TRPA's 1988 Water Quality Management Plan under Section 208 of the Federal Clean Water Act and the Lahontan Regional Water Quality Control Plan.
- 3. The Project will address nonpoint source pollution caused by urban runoff, construction, land development, grazing, and dairy activities that are the major cause for loss of clarity in Lake Tahoe.
- 4. The State Water Resources Control Board (SWRCB) and the State Treasurer are in the process of negotiating a Contract of Agreement to implement the Linked Deposit Program.
- 5. In 1991, the Lahontan Regional Water Quality Control Board completed a Negative Declaration, to comply with the California Environmental Quality Act, that discusses the environmental impacts of individual projects that would be funded under this program.

## THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED THAT:

The SWRCB authorizes \$3 million for a Linked Deposit Program through the SRF to establish the Lake Tahoe BMP Retrofit Project providing the SWRCB and the State Treasurer execute a Contract of Agreement to implement the Linked Deposit Program.
