STATE WATER RESOURCES CONTROL BOARD RESOLUTION NO. 96-075

APPROVING ACCEPTANCE OF THE FEDERAL CLEAN WATER ACT SECTION 319(h) GRANT AND PROJECT PRIORITY LIST AND AUTHORIZING EXECUTION AND AMENDMENT OF CONTRACTS TO IMPLEMENT THE PROJECTS

WHEREAS:

- The Clean Water Act (CWA) Section 319(h) provides grant funds for states to implement Nonpoint Source (NPS) management programs.
- 2. The State Water Resources Control Board (SWRCB) is the designated State agency in California to administer the NPS Program.
- 3. The SWRCB approved a NPS Management Plan on November 15, 1988 which includes activities that the SWRCB and the nine Regional Water Quality Control Boards (RWQCBs) will undertake to control NPS pollution.
- 4. On June 22, 1995, the SWRCB adopted its Strategic Plan which requires the implementation of a Watershed Management Initiative (WMI) and coordination of many SWRCB/RWQCB activities under the WMI.
- 5. The U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (U.S. EPA) has notified the SWRCB that the Federal Fiscal Year (FFY) 1997 CWA Section 319(h) grant allocation will not exceed \$5,600,000.
- 6. The SWRCB's NPS Section distributed a Request for Proposals on March 15, 1996 soliciting for grant-funded NPS projects.
- 7. An NPS Project Priority List (Attachment) was prepared by SWRCB and RWQCBs using the WMI process with advice from the Interagency Advisory Committee.
- 8. The SWRCB elects to extend funding to all projects on the attached NPS Project Priority List even if cost reductions are necessary in some or all projects to meet the funding limitation.
- 9. The SWRCB recognizes the need to address water quality problems related to elevated nitrate levels in ground waters on a statewide basis; therefore, the SWRCB elects to provide partial funding of \$80,000 to the Monterey County Water Resource Agency's project "Reducing Nonpoint Source Nutrient Contamination to Ground Water" as the final project to be added to the FFY 1997 NPS Project Priority List.

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT:

The SWRCB:

- 1. Approves the attached NPS Project Priority List providing that the Monterey County Water Resource Agency's project "Reducing Nonpoint Source Nutrient Contamination to Ground Water" is added to the List for funding at \$80,000, and
- 2. Authorizes the Executive Director to reduce some or all project funding levels as necessary, to ensure minimal, but adequate, funding for all projects on the NPS Project Priority List.
- 3. Authorizes the Executive Director to negotiate and approve program and project workplans not affecting the total grant amount.
- 4. Authorizes the Executive Director, or his designee, to apply for and accept and amend, if appropriate, FFY 1997 CWA Section 319(h) grant for an amount up to \$5,600,000 for support of the NPS Program.
- 5. Authorizes the Executive Director to negotiate and execute contracts and amendments in accordance with the program and project workplans.
