The following changes should be made on Page 2 of Agenda Item 8 to accurately reflect current Regional Board permitting requirements.

Regional Water Board Impact

~~The Lahontan Regional Water Board prescribed Master Water Recycling Requirements (Board Order No. R6V-2007-002) authorizing the District to produce and distribute recycled water to users that operate facilities/systems complying with water recycling requirements contained in California laws and regulations. Waste Discharge Requirements and a National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (NPDES) Permit for the District to annually discharge excess flows to the Grass Valley Creek during emergency wet-weather events. The Lahontan Regional Water Board also issued Cease and Desist Order (CDO) No. R6V-2002-0008, to ensure the District's compliance with the Permit. Additionally, the District accepted the State Water Resources Control Board, Division of Water Rights Order WR 2006-001 that limits the District's withdrawal of surface water from Lake Arrowhead to 1,566 acre feet per calendar year beginning in 2008. Completion of the proposed Project will ensure compliance with the discharge requirements and the CDO, as well as reduce the Districts' need for imported water and partially replace withdrawals from Lake Arrowhead.~~

~~The Lahontan Regional Water Board also issued Cease and Desist Order (CDO) No. R6V-2002-0008, which requires the District to stop unpermitted discharge to Grass Valley Creek or to obtain a discharge permit. A complete application for a National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (NPDES) Permit to discharge excess flows to Grass Valley Creek during emergency wet-weather events is pending completion of a Report of Waste Discharge by the District. The District will pursue additional funding in the future to address the discharge to Grass Valley Creek and ensure compliance with discharge requirements and the CDO.~~

~~The Lahontan Water Board prescribed Master Water Recycling Requirements (Board Order No. R6V-2007-0022) authorizing the District to produce and distribute recycled water to users once it completes construction of the Project and meets other requirements. Additionally, the District accepted the State Water Resources Control Board, Division of Water Rights Order WR 2006-001 that limits the District's withdrawal of surface water from Lake Arrowhead to 1,566 acre feet per calendar year beginning in 2008. Completion of the proposed Project is a necessary~~

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step to allow the District to comply with the Lahontan Water Board's orders as well as reduce the Districts' need for imported water.

The District is also subject to a cease and desist order issued by the Lahontan Water Board requiring the District to stop wet-weather wastewater discharges to unpermitted locations (Grass Valley Creek and unregulated ponds). The District's preferred alternative to achieve compliance with this order is to obtain permission to discharge tertiary treated wastewater to Grass Valley Creek. The Lahontan Water Board amended its Basin Plan to allow for this option and will consider adoption of a National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System Permit for this discharge pending completion of the Report of Waste Discharge by the District.
