**SUBJECT**

REPORT FROM THE STATEWIDE ADVISORY COMMITTEE ON COOLING WATER INTAKE STRUCTURES WITH RECOMMENDATIONS REGARDING THE IMPLEMENTATION SCHEDULES CONTAINED IN THE ONCE-THROUGH COOLING WATER POLICY.

**DISCUSSION**

The Water Quality Control Policy on the Use of Coastal and Estuarine Waters for Power Plant Cooling (Policy) requires the Statewide Advisory Committee on Cooling Water Intake Structures (SACCWIS) to annually provide its recommendations to the State Water Resources Control Board (State Water Board). The committee is designated to advise the State Water Board on the implementation of the Policy to ensure that the implementation plans and schedules for the facilities covered by this Policy are realistic and will not disrupt the State's electrical power supply.

At the April 18, 2016 SACCWIS meeting, SACCWIS members heard a presentation on the Draft 2016 SACCWIS Report. The 2016 SACCWIS Report was adopted by the committee members. The purpose of this informational item is for the SACCWIS, represented by the California Energy Commission SACCWIS member Mr. Robert Oglesby, to present the 2016 SACCWIS Report to the State Water Board. The 2016 SACCWIS Report identifies SACCWIS' conclusions and recommendations regarding the Policy's implementation schedule. At this time SACCWIS does not recommend a change to the implementation schedule set forth in the Policy Report.
