## To Interested Parties:

A Storm Water Management Program (SWMP) to comply with the General Permit for the Discharge of Storm Water from Small Municipal Separate Storm Sewer Systems (Small MS4 Permit) was submitted by Monterey County, Carmel-by-the-Sea, Del Rey Oaks, Marina, the City of Monterey, Pacific Grove, Pebble Beach, Sand City, and Seaside.

The SWMP has been reviewed by Regional Water Quality Control Board (RWQCB) staff and is anticipated to meet the Maximum Extent Practicable (MEP) standard. The SWMP will be available for public review on the State Water Resources Control Board's (SWRCB) website at http://www.swrcb.ca.gov/stormwtr/sm\_municipal\_swmp.html. It will remain there for at least 60 days, during which, a member of the public can request a public hearing by the RWQCB. Request for public hearings must be made in writing to the appropriate RWQCB and be received in that office by 5:00 p.m. on April 19, 2004 and must contain a summary of the reason or reasons the hearing is being requested.

If there are no requests for a public hearing, the permit coverage under the Small MS4 Permit for Monterey County, Carmel-by-the-Sea, Del Rey Oaks, Marina, the City of Monterey, Pacific Grove, Pebble Beach, Sand City, and Seaside will commence on April 20, 2004.
