RECEIVING WATER MONITORING
(Ground Water)

Quarterly groundwater samples shall be grabbed from monitoring wells located upgradient and downgradient of the disposal area and analyzed for:

To ascertain a groundwater gradient, an additional groundwater elevation measurement shall be obtained from a third well.

Reporting

In reporting the monitoring data, the discharger shall arrange the data in tabular form so the date, the constituents, and the concentrations are readily discernable. Reports shall be submitted by the 20th day of each month. The reports shall include the following:

1. All data required by this monitoring program for the monitoring period.
2. An operational summary which shall discuss shut-downs and any non-routine operational changes made to the treatment or discharge system during the reporting period.
3. An evaluation and interpretation of the data.
4. A discussion of non-compliance issues and any recommended modifications to the monitoring program.

All reports required in this monitoring program are requested pursuant to Water Code Section 13267.
