NOTICE OF APPLICABILITY; GENERAL SECTION 401 WATER QUALITY CERTIFICATION ORDER REQUIREMENTS FOR THE CALIFORNIA DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION, 10-1R200 FARMINGTON SR-4 EMERGENCY TRIPLE CULVERT REPLACEMENT PROJECT – RGP8 (WDID#5B39CR00377), SAN JOAQUIN COUNTY

On 19 January 2023, California Department of Transportation (Applicant) filed a notification requesting coverage under the 9 October 2018 State Water Resources Control Board Clean Water Act Section 401 General Water Quality Certification of the United States Army Corps of Engineers (USACE) Regional General Permit 8 (General Certification Order) for the 10-1R200 Farmington SR-4 Emergency Triple Culvert Replacement Project – RGP8 (Project). After review of the notification and the supplemental material submitted by the Applicant, the Central Valley Regional Water Quality Control Board (Central Valley Water Board) has determined that the Project qualifies for enrollment under this General Certification Order. The proposed activity is taking place within 0.031 acre/36 linear feet of waters of the United States.

The Central Valley Water Board is certifying this Project under United States Army Corps of Engineers Regional General Permit 8, Emergency Repair and Protection Activities, subject to the conditions and the notification requirements described in the Nationwide Permit ("Special Conditions"). This Notice of Applicability is being issued under the General Certification Order pursuant to Section 3838 of the California Code of Regulations.

The Project is being conducted in accordance with the requirements contained in this Notice of Applicability and General Certification Order. The Project is described in the notification form requesting coverage under the General Certification Order, dated 20 January 2023, and supplementary information (Application Package). Coverage

under the General Certification Order is no longer valid if the Project (as described) is modified.

PROJECT DESCRIPTION:

The 0.177-acre 10-1R200 Farmington SR-4 Emergency Triple Culvert Replacement Project – RGP8 (Project) consists of conducting emergency replacement work of a triple barrel culvert located on State Route (SR) 4, Postmile (PM) 36.57, within San Joaquin County.

The scope of work includes but is not limited to:

- Removing all loose material from the damaged embankments and stabilize with backfill.
- Installing a temporary dam system.
- Replacing the three existing, damaged 36” Corrugated Steel Pipe (CSP) culverts with three new 36” CSPs.
- Replacing the existing, damaged steel Flared End Sections (FES) with new steel FESs.
- Installing Rock Slope Protection (RSP).
- Rebuilding the shoulder to the original condition and place Hot Mix Asphalt (HMA) on the shoulder.
- Removing and replace all damaged metal beam guardrails.

The Project will permanently impact 0.017 acre/20 linear feet and temporarily impact 0.014 acre/16 linear feet of waters of the United States.

PROJECT LOCATION:

The Project is located at State Route (SR) 4, Postmile (PM) 36.57 in San Joaquin County.

Latitude: 37°56'15.20” and Longitude: -120°56'41.03”

PROJECT SCHEDULE:

The Project started construction on 18 January 2023 and is anticipated to continue until 10 February 2023.

APPLICATION FEE RECEIVED:

The application fee of \$2,734.00 must be received within 30 days from the date of issuance of this Order.

The fee amount was determined as required by California Code of Regulations, title 23, sections 3833(b)(3) and 2200(a)(3), and was calculated as category F- Emergency Projects authorized by a Water Board General Order (fee code 85) with the dredge and fill fee calculator.
