ORDER NO. R5-2009-0025

RESCINDING VARIOUS WASTE DISCHARGE REQUIREMENTS

The California Regional Water Quality Control Board, Central Valley Region, finds that the Board adopted the following Order which is no longer applicable for the reasons shown:

WDRs Order No. 97-005, adopted 24 January 1997, prescribes requirements for the processing and storage of nonhazardous crude oil contaminated soils and oily liquids, for a commercial oil sand/road-mix facility. The facility was operated by Terrain Technology, Inc., a subsidiary of Aera Energy LLC (AERA). All operations were terminated and all non-financial assets, including remaining stockpiles of oily soil, were transferred to AERA. Review of closure reports and an inspection by Central Valley Water Board staff confirmed that the facility has been closed. Remaining stockpiles of nonhazardous soil will be incorporated into road-mix for use on AERA oil field leases. Since Terrain Technology, Inc. has ceased commercial operations, closed the facility, and transferred all non-financial assets to AERA, Order No. 97-005 can be rescinded. (RKW)

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that the above waste discharge requirements Orders and Resolutions are rescinded.
