**NOTICE OF PUBLIC HEARING**  
**concerning**

TENTATIVE WASTE DISCHARGE REQUIREMENTS  
FOR  
RECOLOGY HAY ROAD LANDFILL  
AND JEPSON PRAIRIE ORGANICS  
SOLANO COUNTY

Waste discharge requirements (WDRs) are tentatively being issued to Recology as the operator and landowner, also known as the discharger (Discharger) for the Recology Hay Road Landfill and Jepson Prairie Organics (Facility) located 6426 Hay Road, Vacaville, which is located approximately ten miles south of the community of Dixon in Solano County.

The Facility is an active landfill with four landfill units (LFs): one partially unlined Class III LF; one lined Class III LF; and two Class II lined landfill units. The site also includes a Class II waste pile and the Jepson Prairie Organics composting facility. The composting operation will also be covered under a Notice of Applicability for the General Waste Discharge Requirements for Commercial Composting Operations State Water Resources Control Board Order WQ 2020-0012-DWQ to be issued at the same hearing. This revised Order prescribes waste discharge requirements (WDRs) and requires implementation of an associated monitoring and reporting program (MRP) for the Facility. These tentative WDRs would authorize the Discharger finalize construction design drawings for new LF containment systems and covers, and includes specifications for the continued operation of active units. These tentative WDRs would further include requirements for corrective action, closure, and post closure maintenance of the LFs and waste pile.

The designated parties for this hearing are as follows:

- Recology

Only designated parties will have these rights: to call and examine witnesses; to introduce exhibits; to cross-examine opposing witnesses; to impeach any witness; and to rebut the evidence against him or her. All other persons wishing to testify or provide comments are interested persons and not designated parties. Such interested persons may request status as a designated party for purposes of this hearing by submitting such request in writing to the Central Valley Water Board no later than **5:00 p.m. on 22 April 2022**. The request must explain the basis for status as a designated party and in particular how the person is directly affected by the discharge.

The Tentative Permit was issued for a 30-day public comment period on **22 March 2022** and comments are due by **5:00 p.m. on 22 April 2022**. Written evidence or comments submitted after **5:00 p.m. on 22 April 2022** will not be accepted and will not be incorporated into the administrative record absent a ruling by the Board Chair. Any person requesting to submit late materials must demonstrate good cause for the late submission, and the Chair must find that accepting the late submission will not prejudice the Central Valley Water Board or any Designated Party.

All designated parties and interested persons may speak at the Central Valley Water Board meeting and are expected to orally summarize their written submittals. Oral testimony and cross examination will be limited in time by the Board Chair.
