**AGENDA ITEM: 12**

**SUBJECT:**

The following are proposed Waste Discharge Requirements Orders that regulate discharges to waters of the state. All agencies and the dischargers concur or have offered no comments. Items indicated as updates on the summary agenda make the requirements consistent with current plans and policies of the Board.

**BOARD ACTION:**

Consideration of Waste Discharge Requirements.

**BACKGROUND:**

**A) BASALITE BUILDING PRODUCTS, LLC/ BASALITE CONCRETE PRODUCTS  
SOLANO COUNTY**

On 5 March 2020, Basalite Building Products, LLC (Discharger), submitted a Report of Waste Discharge (RWD) to apply for Waste Discharge Requirements (WDRs) for discharge of wastewater generated from sawing and grinding concrete blocks at the Basalite Concrete Products (Facility) in Dixon, Solano County. The Facility is located at 605 Industrial Way, Dixon in Solano County (Section13, Township 7 North, Range 1 East, Mount Diablo Principal Meridian).

The RWD indicates that the Facility was constructed in 1987 and has not been previously regulated under WDRs. The Discharger owns and operates the Facility and is responsible for compliance with these WDRs.

The Discharger states that approximately 4,300 gallons of processed wastewater is generated during a typical workday. The onsite wastewater treatment and disposal system consists of three concrete Settling Basins, a carbon dioxide gas inject system for wastewater pH neutralization, an unlined effluent Storage Pond, and 16 acres of Land Application Areas (LAAs). The treated wastewater in the Storage Pond is applied to the LAAs via water trucks for dust suppression in the LAAs.

No comments have been received regarding this WDRs Order. No issues have been identified regarding the proposed WDRs. Staff recommends adoption of the proposed WDRs.

**B) CHINA GRADE SANITARY LANDFILL, KERN COUNTY**

County of Kern (Discharger) owns and maintains the China Grade Sanitary Landfill (Facility), which is located approximately 6 miles northeast of the City of Bakersfield in Kern County. The Facility consists of one closed unlined WMU that covers 58 acres. Waste discharge at the Facility ceased in 1992. In October 2009, the Discharger submitted the Construction

Quality Assurance (CQA) Report for the closure of the landfill. The Central Valley Water Board approved the CQA report in October 2010 and has an active corrective action program. The Facility is currently regulated by existing Waste Discharger Requirements Order R5-2012-0123.

The tentative WDRs Order would update the existing Order to allow for continued monitoring, corrective action, and post-closure maintenance.

Comments were received from the Discharger and were incorporated in the WDR.

### **C) SIERRA CONSERVATION CENTER LANDFILL, CA DEPARTMENT OF CORRECTIONS AND REHABILITATION**

California Department of Corrections and Rehabilitation (Discharger) owns and operates the Sierra Conservation Center Landfill (Facility), located at 5100 O'Byrnes Ferry Road in Jamestown, Tuolumne County. The Facility is located on and associated with the Sierra Conservation Center prison complex (Prison Complex), an incarceration center. The Facility is situated on the 240-acre Prison Complex.

The Facility consists of a closed 0.7-acre Class III waste management unit (WMU) regulated by Waste Discharge Requirements (WDRs) Order 96-010, adopted 26 January 1996. The unlined WMU does not possess a leachate collection and removal system (LCRS). Waste characterization indicates that the unit received non-hazardous materials including metals, plastics, household items (e.g., mattresses, shoes, and cutlery), wood, and ash. The Discharger's 2023 JTD included WDR updates, modifications to the MRP, and requested removal of landfill gas monitoring. These revised WDRs include such updates due to the significance changes since the adoption of the previous Order, including the closure of the WMU and installation of additional monitoring wells.

The proposed Order requests the following reports to be submitted: a groundwater network assessment report, sensitive receptor survey, updated waste quality protection standard report, and revised final closure and post closure maintenance plan.

The tentative WDRs Order and accompanying Monitoring and Reporting Program (MRP) were issued for a 30-day public comment period on 30 January 2026 with comments due by 3 March 2026. No comments were received.
