TENTATIVE ORDER R5-2026-XXXX

RESCINDING WASTE DISCHARGE REQUIREMENTS ORDER 94-307

The California Regional Water Quality Control Board, Central Valley Region (Central Valley Water Board), finds that the Central Valley Water Board adopted the following Order which is no longer applicable for the reasons shown:

- a) Waste Discharge Requirements Order 94-307 (WDRs), adopted on 28 October 1994, prescribes requirements for the discharge of process wastewater from a prune dehydrator to an unlined evaporation/percolation pond (Facility) for up to 10,000 gallons per day. When WDRs were adopted, Rio Pluma Company LLC owned and operated the Facility. Rio Pluma ceased drying operations and subsequent discharge over eight years ago. Sacramento Packing, Inc. purchased the property on 9 September 2022 and has no future plan to resume drying operations; therefore, it is appropriate to rescind the WDRs.

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that the above Waste Discharge Requirements Order 94-307 is rescinded.
